I feel very privileged to now be Head of School at Heath Mount. I am looking forward to working with everybody to continually improve our school.



Nasal Flu Vaccination

The annual nasal flu vaccination protects your child against flu, which can be an unpleasant illness and in rare cases can sometime cause serious complications.

The vaccination is given once yearly as a simple spray up each nostril, which is painless, very quick and serious side effects are uncommon. The School Aged Immunisation Service (SAIS) will be offering this vaccination in school on

Friday 18th October.

International Day of Peace
